New This Year

GGT Greek Dance Program! Our Greek Dance Program is in full swing and being taught by Kyria Dimitra Grompou, who also teaches K and grade 4. Classes are held from 4-4:30 on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Guest Teachers and Activities!

Several new interactive learning opportunities were explored this fall in order to encourage active learning, including hands-on and movement activities to include best practices of addressing a variety of learning abilities.

Students in grade 3-6 and THELO participated in a presentation in **Hellenism by Dr. Manos Chaniotakis, CEO of Ergopedia and retired professor at MIT.** He spoke on the importance of learning Greek, and knowing who we are while incorporating the four elements of learning a second language: listening, speaking, reading and writing. Dr. Chaniotakis encouraged the children to question and share their ideas in order to make a difference in the world.

Students in Kindergarten, K1, and 1st & 2nd grade participated in a cooking lesson by **Despina Makredes,** a retired teacher of culinary arts from Everett High School. Mrs. Makredes led a class on making koulourakia and taught baking terms and ingredients to the children in Greek during this hands-on activity.



Students in grade 3-6 and THELO traveled to the Museum of Fine Arts and toured several Greek galleries with Museum Educator, Thomaida Mele, a native Greek speaker with degrees in the study of oral and written language and classical Greek Art. Following the tour, students participated in an art lesson and created their own clay sculptures.

All students were treated to a **Greek dance lesson by Cindi Trent Triantos, educator of theater and dance at The American College of Greece/Deree College in Agia Paraskevi, Athens, Greece.** Our students learned about the origin and role of dance in ancient Greece. A discussion about the meaning of dancing in a circle was followed by a lesson where students performed a circular movement sequence representative of ancient Greek dance. They explored the rhythmic structure of the traditional Kalamatiano which also has its roots in ancient Greek music and dance. Following the student lessons, a special session of Cindi's Kefi Workout, a fitness program that is accompanied by Greek traditional and popular music and familiar Greek dance steps was offered to all parents!

My family and I shared our best learning experiences and friendships during the past two years at Greek Group Tutoring (GGT: https://www.ggtutoring.com/) in Lexington, Massachusetts. We are so happy to know that GGT continues to grow and thrive. I really enjoyed being on the school's board and feel so blessed to have met such a lovely group of teachers, parents and volunteers. My oldest son enjoyed coming to class, taking part in all the fun activities GGT in Lexington had to offer, and making dear friends.
